REGULAR MEETING - - MAY 2, 2011

The Council of the Township of Monroe met in the Municipal Building, 1 Municipal Plaza, for a Regular Meeting.

The Regular Meeting was Called to Order at 7:30 p.m. by Council President Gerald W. Tamburro with a Salute to the Flag.

(Name changes for Office on Aging to Office of Senior Services and Monroe Township Department of Water and Sewer Utility to Monroe Township Utility Department)

ORDINANCE as follows: (O-5-2011-014)

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Monroe, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey that Chapter 3 of the Code of the Township of Monroe entitled, "Administration of Government", Article VI and Article IX is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

SECTION 1.

ARTICLE VI DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE

3-53.7 Division of Senior Services

- A.** Within the Department of Administration and Finance, there shall be a Division of Senior Services which shall consist of an Office of Senior Services which shall be the Director/Outreach Coordinator of the Office of Senior Services.
- B.** The Director/Outreach Coordinator of the Office of Senior Services will operate under the Director of the Department of Administration and Finance and will perform such duties as required by statute and as periodically assigned. The Director shall submit annually, for the consideration of the Mayor and Council of the Township of Monroe, a proposed budget for the Office of Senior Services.
- C.** The Division through the Office of Senior Services shall:

ARTICLE IX THE MONROE TOWNSHIP UTILITY DEPARTMENT

3- 63. Establishment; Control

The Monroe Township Utility Department (the "Department") is hereby created in and for the township, which Department shall be under the control and supervision of the township. The Mayor shall appoint a Director of the Monroe Township Utility Department (the "Director").

3- 65. Definitions

As used in this Chapter:

- A.** MONROE TOWNSHIP UTILITY DEPARTMENT (M.T.U.D.) –shall mean the water services and sanitary sewer utility of the Township, operated by the Department acting pursuant to the direction of the Township through its elected and appointed officials, and performing all functions pertaining to the provision of water and the collection of sewage heretofore performed by MTMUA and as may hereafter be necessary in connection with any additional facilities hereafter constituting part of the Township's Sewage System.

- B. DIRECTOR - shall mean the duly appointed Director of the Monroe Township Utility Department or in the absence of such Director, the Director of the Department of Public Works of the Township.
- C. LICENSED OPERATOR - shall mean the duly appointed operational administrator(s) of the Monroe Township Utility Department and in particular shall be understood to be the Township agent(s), servant(s) or employee(s) in charge of the day to day operation, installation and maintenance of the sanitary sewer facilities and water facilities heretofore operated by the MTMUA and as may hereafter be necessary in connection with any additional facilities hereafter constituting part of the Township's Water and Sewer Systems. Such operator shall be properly licensed and qualified by the State of New Jersey to perform the necessary functions attendant to this position.

3- 66. Authorization to adopt rules and procedures.

The Township Council of the Township of Monroe is hereby empowered to adopt, by Resolution, such portions of the current rules regulating the Township of Monroe Township Utility Department as it deems proper and necessary in order to enable the Department to perform the purposes enumerated herein and any additional rules. In addition, the Township is hereby empowered to retain the professional services of such sanitarian, engineer, or other expert as the Township shall determine to be necessary for the purpose of establishing appropriate Rules and Regulations affecting the installation, maintenance, repair and control of plumbing and drainage of buildings and the connection thereof to the facilities of the Monroe Township Utility Department. These rules and regulations may be adopted by the Township by resolution and may by reference incorporate other codes, statutes and/or regulations as appropriate.

3- 66.1 Transition Period

There is hereby established a transition period of 120 days duration, during which time the Director of the Department shall assume the operation of the Monroe Township Utility Department functions heretofore carried out by the MTMUA. During such transition time, which may be extended by Resolution of the Township for such reasonable time as it deems proper and just, the Director of such Department shall utilize the rules and procedures as established by the MTMUA which, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:49-5.1, are annexed to this ordinance and three (3) copies of which have been placed on file upon the introduction of this ordinance and are now filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Township of Monroe, and which will remain on file there for the use and examination of the public, except where such rules and procedures are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.

3- 66.2 Reservation of Powers.

To the extent not specifically set forth herein, the Township Council of the Township of Monroe specifically reserves unto itself all those certain powers, rights and responsibilities as set forth at length in N.J.S.A. 40A:26A-1 et seq.; which provisions may be deemed by the Township necessary for the operation of the Monroe Township Utility Department;

3- 66.13 Utility Department Established.

The existing publicly owned and operated water and sanitary sewer system of the Township, previously operated by the MTMUA, shall be operated by the Township as a dedicated utility of the Township of Monroe. Such water and sewer utility shall hereafter be referred to as the Monroe Township Utility Department ("M.T.U.D."), which shall be operated by the Department, under the control of the Director.

3– 66.14 Utility Department Fund.

All future revenue and the accounting therefore from said Monroe Township Utility Department shall be on a dedicated utility basis in conformance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-33, 34 and 35. All monies derived from the operation of said Monroe Township Utility Department and any other monies applicable to its support shall be segregated and kept in a separate fund which shall be known as the “Monroe Township Utility Department Fund”, and all disbursements for the operation and maintenance of said Monroe Township Utility Department shall be taken from said Sewer Utilities Fund.

3 – 66.15 Budget.

The dedicated budget of the Monroe Township Utility Department shall include appropriations for operating expenses, capital improvements, debt service, and for the portion of all other deferred charges and statutory expenses as may be required.

3 – 66.19 Water and Sewer User Charges.

The Township Council is hereby authorized to establish, from time to time, the charges and fees for sewer and incidental services to be provided by the Monroe Township Utility Department. The schedule of charges shall be, and the same are, hereby fixed and established for the collection, disposal and treatment of sanitary sewage material collected in public sanitary sewers located within the Township and provision of potable and non-potable water, to be charged to all customers of the Monroe Township Utility Department and properties served by the public sewage collection system located within the Township of Monroe, as set forth in Exhibit “A” annexed hereto and made part hereof, same being the charges currently in effect for the MTMUA.

3 – 66.20 Job Titles and Rules and Regulations of the MTMUA.

All job titles and salaries existing in the MTMUA, as well as all rules and regulations of the MTMUA, shall be adopted by the Monroe Township Utility Department to the extent that said job titles, rules and regulations do not conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance. In the event of an inconsistency, the terms of this Ordinance shall prevail.

SECTION 4.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 5.

If any section, paragraph, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 6.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

Mayor – mentioned what an excellent job the Committee does on the Henry Ricklis Holocaust Services at the Monroe Township High School that he attended yesterday. He advised that these services have been held for the past 26 years.

Administrator – stated that the Fire Consolidation Report is due to be received on Thursday and available to the public in the Clerk’s Office on Friday. Also spoke on the Fund Drive being conducted by the Volunteer 1st Aid Squad.

Twp. Engineer – reported on the upgrading to the lighting at the Municipal Building which is being funded by a Federal Grant. This is an electrical savings of about 30%.

Engineer Feist also announced there are two projects on Applegarth Road about to begin. The first being the traffic signalization at the intersection of Applegarth Rd and the main entrance to Clearbrook and across the street from that will be the Applegarth Rd Park & Ride West.

Council:

Councilman Koppel – No Report.

Councilman Leibowitz – spoke on the Henry Ricklis Holocaust Services and what a great job the Committee does.

Councilman Nalitt – announced that the Monroe Township Library Director Irene Goldberg will be honored tomorrow evening as “Library Director of the Year” for the NJ State Library Assoc.

Council Vice-President Miller – Reiterated the Mayor’s comments on the Henry Ricklis Holocaust Services. He also expressed his disappointment that the school budget did not pass.

Council President Tamburro – Also attended the Henry Ricklis Holocaust Services and always finds it to be a very moving experience. Teachers were honored that teach the history of the Holocaust, which is a mandatory course in the school system of NJ.

Today he, along with the Mayor and Business Administrator, attended a meeting with representatives of the Board of Education to go over some thoughts as to what can be done with the defeated budget. There will be a Special Joint Meeting with the Council and Board of Education next Monday at 7pm.

PUBLIC:

Tom Nothstein, 15 Nathaniel St. questioned the following items on the Agenda:

Item #20.d. – the amount of add'l fees paid to Shain, Schaffer & Rafanello for 2011 Tax Appeals. Administrator Hamilton responded that this is \$75,000, which is in addition to an earlier authorization of \$75,000. The budgeted amount for this year’s Appeals is \$245,000.

Item #20.e. & f. – modification to MJ Barone Associates and Epic’s contracts – Administrator Hamilton explained this is regarding the Close-out of the Community Center project.

Item #20.j. – Revaluation Bid – Asked the cost and number of bidders. Administrator Hamilton responded that there were two bids received and Realty Appraisal Services was awarded the Bid in the amount of \$1,195,265.

Asked the time-line of the Consolidation Report coming out on Friday. Council President Tamburro responded that it is based on recommendations. They will be better prepared at the next Council Meeting to address a time-line on dealing with the recommendations.

Mr. Nothstein commented on the defeated Budget for the Board of Education, stating that he feels it is important to not “just pass a budget”. It is one of the few times that the taxpayers have a voice in the process.

Robert Roche, 18 Muirhead Blvd. – spoke about the NJ Supreme Court and their belief that throwing money at Abbott School Districts is a good thing. He also spoke on various points regarding the Board of Education proposed Budget.

Council Vice President Miller – clarified his points regarding the defeated School Budget.

Mark Klein, 53 Turnberry Dr. (member of the BOE) – stated that the Board of Education Budget is a good Budget, however, he takes exception to the unfair distribution of State Aid and the unrealistic formula that is used in calculating what a municipality will receive. He advised the new high school has been built and will be opening with no State Aid or Grant Money. This reality is almost unheard of.

Michele Arminio, 9 Nathaniel St. - Questioned Item #18 – Acquisition of certain parcels of land identified as Block 109.3, Lots 2, 3 & 20. Asked the location of the property and was told it is off Old Forge Road. She then asked if it was going to help with the flood remediation. Engineer Feist advised that it will not, but will have more details regarding that issue at the next meeting.

Ms. Arminio confirmed the date and time the Council will conduct the Public Hearing on the defeated School Budget and urged them to look at the waste of funds rather than the use of funds.

UPON MOTION made by Councilman Nalitt and seconded by Councilman Leibowitz, the Regular Meeting of Council was Adjourned at 8:25 PM.
