

**Eligibility** – All adults and students over 10 years of age where welcome in the Community Education Program.

**Discounts** – A five dollar (\$5.00) senior discount is offered to those 60 years and older, as well as any employee of the Monroe Township Board of Education. **Please note: there are no discounts on any course \$12 or less.** 

**Materials Fees** – Must be paid to the instructor on the first night of class. Cash is preferred.

**Returned Checks** – A \$40 fee will be imposed for checks returned unpaid by the bank.

**Refund and withdrawal** – We will refund course fee if we cancel a class. All withdrawals within one week (7 days) prior to the class start will receive a refund minus an \$8 processing fee. No refunds or credits will be granted when you withdraw from a one night class with an \$8 fee.
