

MONROE TOWNSHIP TROPICAL STORM HENRI FLOODING WINTER EMERGENCY RECOVERY PROGRAM

APPLICATION

To assist Monroe Township homeowners who suffered certain property damage from Tropical Storm Henri impacting their health and safety in the upcoming winter months, the Monroe Township Mayor and Council have authorized using federal funds available through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Particularly considering the COVID-19 pandemic, the Township aims to assist victims of Henri with certain essential household health and safety repairs, specifically to address necessities for safety during the winter. This limited federal funding creates a <u>unique one-time opportunity</u> where the Township will administer these funds to reimburse residential property owners up to \$5,000.00 per household to repair or remediate critical life safety damage listed below, that was sustained during Tropical Storm Henri.

The following Conditions apply for receiving these funds:

- *Homeowners* (not tenants) must submit this application and all supporting documents to the Township.
- The Township will reimburse homeowners up to \$5,000.00 total per household to repair, replace, or remediate ONLY the specific items listed below (necessary for health and/or safety of residents during the winter months).
- Homeowner applicants must submit all receipts for repair, replacement, or remediation of the items listed below to receive reimbursement, as well as copies of any and all permits as necessary.
- This funding is available to reimburse only the repair, replacement, or remediation specific items damaged during *Tropical Storm Henri* on August 21-22, 2021, and is not available for damage caused by any other circumstance or other weather event. Homeowner applicants must provide supporting documentation to the Township that they sustained damage specifically from *Tropical Storm Henri*.¹
- This funding is not available to business owners².
- This funding is only available to reimburse repairs, replacement, or remediation that is NOT
 reimbursed by any other source of financial assistance, including but not limited to FEMA
 disaster assistance, insurance coverage, or affordable housing assistance. Homeowner
 applicants must attest in writing below that they have not been reimbursed by other sources.

¹ A homeowner applicant whose residence was evaluated for damage by OEM and the Township Construction Office during the week of August 22 need not provide such documentation.

² Business Owners are eligible for NJEDA grant funding.

• This application form and all supporting documentation must be received, as instructed below, by December 31, 2021.

The specific structures, fixtures, or appliances necessary for health and safety of residents in preparation for winter, and eligible for reimbursement are:

- Heating Unit (furnace/air handler/baseboard) and Thermostats
- Mold remediation
- Insulation and Drywall replacement where damaged
- Electrical Panel, Wiring and Outlets
