Mr. Parab asked for an explanation of R-11-2021-231, asking what the leachate force main is for and if we are receiving grants for this as the cost is \$2.9 million; Attorney Rainone answered that the leachate is a product of the BFI landfill and the force main will take it directly to a pump station where from there it would go to the County utilities. He added that there are further discussions about the costs ongoing with BFI.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the contract is awarded with the stipulation that *Fernandes Construction, Inc.* shall comply with Affirmative Action Regulations, including revising their contracts as necessary to add mandatory affirmative action language, and submitting either a letter of federal approval or a certificate of employee information report, or a completed form AA302 at the time the signed contracts are returned to the Township of Monroe, or seven (7) days thereafter, or risk being declared non-responsive and forfeiting the award.

Administrator's Report – Thanked the Mayor and Council for moving forward with the force main for the BFI landfill, noting that it is a good thing for the neighborhood.

Engineer's Report – Reported that the Council introduced an ordinance to begin the acquisition of land for the intersection improvement grant project at the intersection of Mounts Mills Road and Old Bridge-Englishtown Road.

Council's Reports -

Councilman Dipierro -

- Thanked the Township employees as it has been difficult with Covid and all departments have done a phenomenal job through this time.
- Stated that there was a carjacking done at gunpoint and he passed the message to Chief Biennas, Administrator Weinberg and Mayor Dalina but has heard nothing back about alerting our residents. He reminded everyone to keep doors locked and lights on and watch out for one another as a community.
- Asked for an update on the ADA inclusive playground at the Prospect Plains Soccer Complex;
 Engineer Rasimowicz answered that we are close to going out to bid and anticipate that to happen in the next couple of weeks.
- Commented about the sewer connection at Daniel Ryan Field for the old building as he does not want that to get left behind and it is needs to be connected to the public sewer system.
- Asked for the timeframe on the punch list for the Matchaponix/Spotswood Gravel Hill Road Improvement Project; Engineer Rasimowicz responded that they have been actively working on it but there is no formal close out as it has to go through the County. He noted that they have finished with the landscaping.
- Commented that no proposals were received for the snow bid and asked when that would be coming out; Administrator Weinberg answered that we have an active contract with one company with larger trucks but are looking for one with smaller trucks. He added that this needs to be discussed further with DPW as this type of bid is very competitive and difficult, but we have so far been able to keep up with the snow plowing with DPW and the existing contract.

Council Vice-President Schneider -

- Participated in the Trick or Treat drive-thru at the Recreation Center and passed out goodie bags to all who drove through which was a pleasure.
- Commented that Octoberfest was wonderful and thanked all of the volunteers who made it a success.
- Thanked everyone who helped get her elected.
- Updated everyone that the contractors have begun work on her home and she is very pleased.

Councilman Van Dzura -

- Commented that Octoberfest was a great day for all.
- Noted that we received approval for another State grant for roadway improvements, notably for Spotswood-Englishtown Road and extended thanks to the Administration for moving forward with these improvements.
- Complimented the Township for moving forward with the force main for the BFI landfill, stating that it is nice to see action being taken.
- Noted that the traffic light at Mounts Mills Road is also moving forward.
- Stated that there is a Veteran's celebration at the Senior Center on Friday and a wreath laying ceremony at 9:00am at the Municipal Building.
- Wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

Councilman Baskin -

- Congratulated all the candidates who ran in the election.
- Discussed some Election Day voting challenges and how he worked in North Brunswick as a poll
 worker.

Council President Cohen -

- Invited all to attend the Veteran's Day celebrations and commented how she is a Daughter and Niece of WWII veterans..
- Thanked the Clerk's Office for all they did during the election.

Mayor's Report – Thanked the Clerk's Office for all they did during the election and for being able to put together the Council meeting the very next day.

Commented that he is happy to see some who participated in the election process here in the audience and noted that he is looking forward to working together with everyone here as well. He noted that we all want the best for the Township and with the election being over we must focus on governance.

Invited all to attend the Veteran's Day ceremonies on November 11th at the Municipal Building and Avenue K.

Wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

Township Clerk Patricia Reid – Thanked her staff, continued support of Mayor Dalina, Council, Administrator Weinberg and the entire administration for their support, as well as, to Greg Slavicek and DPW staff with signage and daily help. Leah and the Library for hosting the early voting event, Chief Biennas and his staff for the security at the drop box and the local chairs, poll worker coordinators and poll workers. She also extended thanks to the voters who remained patient through the new voting process.

UPON MOTION made by Councilman Baskin and seconded by Council Vice-President Schneider, the **PUBLIC COMMENTS** portion of the Meeting was opened. All were in favor, none opposed.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

<u>Christine Patterson</u>, 14 <u>Lincoln Ct.</u> – Ms. Patterson congratulated everyone and stated she is grateful in knowing that all will do their best for the Township.

Praised the Clerk's Office for all of their hard work and understanding.

Asked if there was a way to address the political sign ordinance to try and tighten up some aspects as she stated that she does not want to restrict people's right to express themselves but there should be sometime about 12 signs for the same person within 2 feet of each other. She asked if a spacing requirement could be made and if there is a way to make sign stealing more than just a disorderly person's offense.

<u>Andrea Pellezzi, 57 Yorkshire Dr. – Ms. Pellezzi commented that the League of Women Voter's had a meeting and discussed the signage issues. She stated that she requested a copy of the sign ordinance from the Clerk's Office and noted that as soon as the League of Women Voter's goes through that they will be happy to share their findings.</u>

<u>George Gunkelman, 5 Kelly Ct.</u> – Mr. Gunkelman congratulated and thanked all the winning candidates. He stated that regardless of what happens, the courage to run and put yourself up front is a great task.

Mr. Gunkelman asked in regard to R-11-2021-231 if that was a complete bid, as well as, if it takes care of repaving, if there is a bond for refill once it settles and how complete is the bid and what else are we on the hook for. Administrator Weinberg answered that this is the longest lead item and covers everything. He added that there will be a separate bid item regarding a pump line.

Mr. Gunkelman asked in regard to R-11-2021-220 what we are demolishing and where this is located, as well as, how many bids were received. Administrator Weinberg answered that this is for 2 locations, one at the corner of Mounts Mills Road and Buckelew Avenue, where there is the former farm, we will be taking down 2 buildings. The next one is located on Spotswood-Englishtown Road where we will be taking down the old police building. He noted that we are working with the County to preserve the land. Engineer Rasimowicz answered that 5 bids were received for the project.

<u>Prakash Parab, 33 Dayna Dr. – Mr. Parab commented that tomorrow, November 4th is Diwali. He wished everyone a Happy Diwali and Thanksgiving.</u>

Commented that we have to appreciate the people who run for elections and extended congratulations to all of those who won.

Commented regarding the sign ordinance that it will be debated and will bring constitutional rights into play.

Shared that the India Civic Association will be collecting food for Diwali with it being donated to local food pantries.

Mr. Parab asked how local residential areas without HOAS will have their roadways taken care of as his area has hundreds of cracks and fissures in the roadways. He asked if they were going to be sealed and how will it be made sure that the damage is controlled; Administrator Weinberg answered that the DPW evaluates the roadways and every year we sit with the Police, DPW and Engineering departments to decide which roadways need the most help. He added that he will take note of this.

<u>Michelle Arminio, 9 Nathaniel St. – Mrs. Arminio congratulated all for the election and wished good luck to all. She added to keep in mind that those chosen to govern all constituents of Monroe.</u>

Commented that she is disappointed to see that the resolution for the shared services agreement between the Township and Board of Education is not on tonight's agenda and hopes that promises are kept now that the election is over; Mayor Dalina responded, stating that he just received the agreement, so he was unable to add it to tonight's agenda but guarantees it will be on December's meeting.

Mrs. Arminio stated that during the election some people were turned away without being offered a provisional ballot and there is something wrong with that. She added that there were so many issues with people being turned away that the League of Women Voter's and the Civil Liberties tried to extend the polling time but were denied by a judge. She stated that if poll workers do not know that people can be provided with provisional ballots then that is wrong, and a voter should never be turned away.

Lastly, Mrs. Arminio commented that both parties do not have clean hands when it comes to signage and she wants the discussion to be fair and not directed toward those people with who the voters do not agree with.

UPON MOTION made by Council Vice-President Schneider and seconded by Councilman Dipierro, the **PUBLIC COMMENTS** portion of the Meeting was closed. All were in favor, none opposed.
